O Gracious and Holy Father . . .

Come Away for a While



For three and a half years we waited for the chance to hold our “triennial” gathering of Daughters from all over our province. With all the trials of the last several years, I am grateful that Donna and her committee felt what we all needed was a time of rest and renewal of our sense of joy in the

Lord. Our scripture theme was Romans 15:13, and the weekend they planned so meticulously invited us to live out Paul’s message.

The Franciscan Renewal Center (the Casa), located in Scottsdale, Arizona, in the heart of the Sonora Desert, was perfect for this purpose. To me, it brought to mind two additional scriptures: Mark 6:31-33, in which Jesus said to His disciples [Daughters]: “Come away by yourselves with me to a desolate place and rest a while,” and I Peter 1: 8, “Though you have not seen him you believe in him and rejoice with joy that is inexpressible and filled with glory.”

What struck me the most about the meeting was the setting of the Casa, a retreat center set aside by Franciscans for anyone to come and be refreshed. To me, a Floridian, the Casa was the perfect place to intro-

duce someone to the experience of contemplation in the wilderness. The main thing I learned in my short encounter with the labyrinth made of rocks was that as I walked “the Way,” I found that, as in my spiritual walks, I would set off to get close to God in the center, but then see that my path often led away from Him; ultimately, I did reach the center, but not as I expected. Paths twisted and turned to create places to meet with others, or to sit, to rest, and to contemplate in solitude. This wilderness setting at first seemed barren, but then I would see splashes of color from beautiful flowers on the varieties of prickly cacti among the many rocks (“even the rocks will cry out,” Luke 19: 40), and a few rabbits appeared in the early morning sun, as birds, quail and even a roadrunner, scurried about (“all creation worships You,” Psalm 66:4). It was exhilarating and refreshing.

Oh, Gracious and Holy Father, thank You for Your great abundance in creating all things, including us, Your Daughters. May we not miss the opportunities to see Your handiwork about us no matter where we are, to delight in them, and to rest in You and find true joy, no matter what our circumstances are.

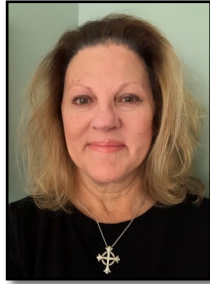

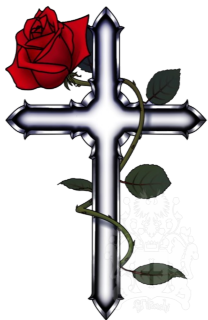

The Daughters of The Way chapter was instituted on May 1, 2022, by Bishop David Bena, retired bishop of the Anglican Diocese of the Living Word, at the Church of the Resurrection, Halfmoon, NY. Four new members were installed and Deacon Dawn Skramstad, who was a member of The Emmaus Chapter at St. Thomas Anglican, transferred to this new chapter. Members of the Emmaus Chapter

joined us for the service. Our service project was to provide gift bags of personal care items for women and children in domestic abuse shelters through Healing a Woman's Soul ministry in Albany, NY. The project was so well received that the parish decided to continue providing gift bags on a monthly basis.

These levels are comparable to soldiers serving in battle. Jacqueline is committed to seeing that missionaries burn with passion... not burn out!

In 2000, on their 15th wedding anniversary, Jacqueline and her husband, Tanie, approached the Lord with the

question, “What would You have us do for the rest of our lives?” God answered with swift and distinct clarity (even to the point of naming the ministry), and Forget-Me-Not Ministries was born.

Since that time, their lives have been devoted to being what many affectionately refer to as, “missionaries to missionaries,” traveling wherever there is a need in the world, ministering healing and pastoral care to missionaries. They also engage in training, coaching and mentoring missionaries for sustained well-being and increased success in their own spiritual growth, as well as in discipling others.

When not in the field, Jacqueline and Tanie host missionaries in their home. They look forward to one day fulfilling the only outstanding piece of the vision God gave them over 20 years ago—Forget-Me-Not Manor, a respite where missionaries are welcomed to “Come with Me by yourselves to a quiet place and get some rest,” (Mark 6:31).
